Royal Doulton The Gallant Fishers Series

Royal Doulton introduced "The Gallant Fishers Series" in the first half of 1913 and production was ceased in circa 1936. It only has the one pattern number D3680 issued against it. It has it a special "The Gallant Fishers" back stamp. This series consists of six characters and three quotes. The Quotations

1. "O the gallant fisher's life it is the best of any."
2. "And when the timorous trout I wait to take and he devours my bait."
3. "Of recreations there is none so free as fishing is alone." The Characters1. Man on one knee fishing from bank.
