

Jug Shapes

This is the home of the various shapes of Royal Doulton's Jugs and Pitchers. Not included in this category are creamers. Creamers live in the Tea & Coffee Ware category. Where possible we will identify the shape name and the size range that they came in and the pattern name and the production era of the example. What also must be remembered is that various series that were applied to embossed shapes often do not have shape names, such series include Famous Ships and Moorish Gateway, when I can identify shape numbers I will. Louise Irvine identifies 39 jugs, but of course there will be more than this.

Olaf The lid on this Olaf jug is really very slick, it has a counter balance built into it so that as the jug is tipped to pour the cover lifts so the contents can flow from the spout. I do not believe this came out of the factory with the lid, I believe that it was fitted outside the factory, the metal work was very light weight and there was no impressed hall mark, which is normally the case with metal work applied in the factory, but it is still very sweet all the same. What I find really unusual about this photo is the Fat Boy example is a left handed example, where the Trotty Veck is a right handed example. I wonder if this was a mistake on the day or if it was standard practice to produce both left handed and right handed examples of the jug.
